The Busia Municipal Council (Parking) Bye-Laws, 2015.

(Under Section 39(1) of the Local Government Act, Cap. 243)

IN EXERCISE of powers conferred upon the Busia Municipal Council by section 39 (1) of the Local Government Act, these Bye-laws are made this 26th day of May, 2015.

1. Citation.

These Bye-laws may be cited as the Busia Municipal Council (Parking) Bye-laws, 2015.

2. Application.

These Bye-laws shall apply to all areas within the jurisdiction of Busia Municipal Council

3. Interpretation.

In these Bye-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

“Council” means the Busia Municipal Council;

“currency point” has the value assigned to it in the Schedule to these Bye laws;

“vehicle” include a machine or implement of any kind which is drawn or propelled along roads whether by animal, mechanical, electrical or any other motive power.

4. Objective.

The objective of these Bye-laws is to regulate the parking of vehicles, motor cycles and bicycles on streets and other designated parking places of the Council with a view to maintaining order, safeguarding pedestrians and other street users and to raising revenue for the Council.

5. Zoning of parking places.

The Council shall zone areas within the Municipality into designated parking places.

6. Authorised parking.

A person shall not park a vehicle, motorcycle or bicycle within the municipality except in a designated parking place.

7. Approved agents.

The council may appoint agents to carry out on its behalf, the functions conferred upon it by these Bye –laws.

8. Parking fees.

The Council shall charge parking fees in respect of the vehicles parked within the Council.

9. Offences and penalties.

(1) Any person who contravenes these Bye-Laws commits an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine not exceeding five currency points or imprisonment not exceeding six months.

(2) In addition to the penalty provided under subparagraph (1), any expense incurred by the Council as a result of breach of these Bye-Laws, shall be paid to the Council by the person in breach.

10. Towing or clamping of vehicles.

(1) Notwithstanding paragraph 9, the Council may tow or clamp any vehicle whose driver contravenes these Bye – Laws.


(2) A person whose vehicle is towed or clamped shall pay to the Council the fees for towing or clamping.
