## 2003 No. 52.

**The Uganda Wildlife (Declaration of Wildlife Conservation Area) (Ajais Wildlife Reserve) Instrument, 2003.**

*(Under sections 18, 19 and 94 of the Uganda Wildlife Statute, 1996, Statute No. 14 of 1996).*

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Minister responsible for wildlife by sections 18, 19 and 94 of the Uganda Wildlife Statute, 1996; and after consultation with the local government council of Arua District; and with the approval of Parliament signified by its resolution passed on 27th May 2002, this Instrument is made this 3rd day of April, 2003.

**1. Citation**

This Instrument may be cited as the Uganda Wildlife (Declaration of Wildlife Conservation Area) (Ajais Wildlife Reserve) Instrument, 2003.

**2. Declaration of Ajais Wildlife Game Reserve as wildlife conservation area**

The area of land specified in the Schedule to this Instrument is declared a wildlife conservation area to be known as Ajais Wildlife Reserve.

**3. Area to be a wildlife reserve and a wildlife protected area**

The area declared under paragraph 2 shall be a wildlife reserve and a wildlife protected area for the purposes of section 19 of the Uganda Wildlife Statute, 1996.

**4. Amendment of S.I. 147 of 1965**

The Game Reserves Declaration Notice, 1965 is amended by revoking any reference to Ajais Wildlife Game Reserve.

## SCHEDULE

**Boundaries of Ajais Wildlife Reserve**

Commencing at the Acharo River bridge on the Inde-Pakwach road; thence following the west side of the said road north-westwards to beacon AJ1 at mile 34; thence due west following a marked line to beacon AJ2 on the Inde-Okollo road; thence following the north side of the said road in a south-westerly direction to beacon AJ3; thence westwards following a marked line to beacon AJ4; thence southwards following a marked line to beacon AJ5 on the Inde-Okollo road; thence following the north side of the said road to a bridge crossing a river 2.75 kilometers north of the village of Utrutru; thence following that unnamed river south-westwards to its source; thence north-westwards to beacon AJ6 on the River Linya; thence following that river north-eastwards to beacon AJ7; thence eastwards following a marked line to beacon AJ8; thence northwards following a marked line, crossing Inde-Pakwach road, to beacon AJ9; thence north-westwards following a marked line to beacon AJ10; thence northwards following a marked line to beacon AJ11 at the south-eastern edge of a papyrus swamp; thence eastwards along a marked line to the Acha swamp; thence following the western edge of that swamp northwards to the mouth of the

Acha river; thence following the northern edge of the Acha swamp to beacon AJ12; thence southwards along a marked line to beacon AJ13 on the Inde-Rhino Camp road; thence south-eastwards along a marked line to beacon AJ14 at the edge of the Obei swamp; thence following the northern edge of the Obei swamp eastwards to beacon AJ15; thence in a straight line south-eastwards to a buoy on the edge of the main channel of the Albert Nile, at UTM Zone 36N Northing 318800; thence following the main channel of the Albert Nile southwards to a buoy at UTM Zone 36N Northing 315550; thence westwards to the mouth of the Acharo river; thence following the Acharo river to the point of commencement.

This boundary is more particularly shown on Boundary Plan UG/WILDLIFE/AJAIS /01 deposited at the Survey Records Office in the Department Responsible for Surveys and Mapping.
