The Uganda Wildlife (Declaration of Wildlife Conservation Area) (Kashaka Wildlife Sanctuary) Instrument, 2003.

(Under sections 18 and 19 of the Uganda Wildlife Statute, 1996, Statute No. 14 of 1996).

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Minister responsible for wildlife by sections 18 and 19 of the Uganda Wildlife Statute, 1996; and after consultation with the local government council of Bushenyi District; and with the approval of Parliament signified by its resolution passed on 27th May 2002, this Instrument is made this 3rd day of April, 2003.

1. Citation

This Instrument may be cited as the Uganda Wildlife (Declaration of Wildlife Conservation Area) (Kashaka Wildlife Sanctuary) Instrument, 2003.

2. Declaration of Kashaka Wildlife Sanctuary as wildlife conservation area

The area of land specified in the Schedule to this Instrument is declared a wildlife conservation area to be known as Kashaka Wildlife Sanctuary.

3. Area to be a wildlife sanctuary and a wildlife management area

The area declared under paragraph 2 shall be a wildlife sanctuary and a wildlife management area for the purposes of section 19 of the Uganda Wildlife Statute, 1996.

SCHEDULE

Boundaries of Kashaka Wildlife Sanctuary

Commencing at pillar KSH 2 on the shore of Lake George, thence in a southerly direction on bearing 196.9° for a distance of 181.1 metres approximately to pillar KAS1; thence on a bearing of 230.8° for a distance of 96.8 metres approximately to pillar KAS2; thence on a bearing of 242.8° for a distance of 222 metres approximately to pillar KAS3; thence on a bearing of 284.6° for a distance of 108.5 metres approximately to pillar KAS4; thence on a bearing of 289.4° for a distance of 78.6 metres approximately to pillar KAS5; thence on a bearing of 271.3° for a distance of 205.6 metres approximately to pillar KAS6; thence on a bearing of 260.8° for a distance of 233.4 metres approximately to pillar KAS7; thence on a bearing 330.7° for a distance of 94.6 metres approximately to pillar KAS8; thence on a bearing of 23.6° for a distance of 116.8 metres approximately to pillar KAS9; thence on a bearing 43.4° for a

distance of 121.3 metres approximately to pillar KAS10; thence on a bearing of 60.5° for a distance of 166.8 metres to pillar KSH 1 on the shore of Lake George; thence eastwards along the shore of Lake George to the point of commencement.

This boundary is more particularly shown on Boundary Plan UG/WILDLIFE/QENP/01 deposited at the Survey Records Office in the Department Responsible for Surveys and Mapping.
